

Weekday Morning Prayers

Amidah of Shakharit

אֲדֹנָי My Master, open my lips, and my mouth will declare Your praise.

בְּרוּךְ Blessed are You, Adonai, our God, and God of our fathers, God of Avra'am, God of Yitshak, and God of Yaakov, the Almighty, the Great, the Powerful, the Awesome, most high Almighty, Who bestows beneficent kindness, Who possesses everything, Who remembers the kindnesses of the Patriarchs, and Who brings a redeemer to their children's children, for the sake of His Name, with love.

Between Rosh Ashanah and Yom Kippur

זְכַרְנוּ Remember us for life, King, Who desires life; inscribe us in the Book of Life, for Your sake, Living God.

מֶלֶךְ King, Helper, Deliverer and Shield. Blessed are You, Adonai, Shield of Avra'am.

אֲתָהּ You are mighty forever, my Master; You are the one Who resurrects the dead; the Powerful One to deliver us.

Summer: **מוֹרִיד** The one Who causes the dew to descend.

Winter: **מְשִׁיב** The one Who causes the wind to blow and the rain to fall.

מְכַלְכֵּל The one Who sustains the living with kindness, the one Who resurrects the dead with great mercy, the one Who supports the fallen, the one Who heals the sick, the one Who releases the imprisoned, and the one Who fulfills His faithfulness to those who sleep in the dust. Who is like You, Master of mighty deeds, and who can be compared to You? King, Who causes death and restores life, and causes deliverance to sprout forth.

Between Rosh Ashanah and Yom Kippur

כִּי Who is like You merciful Father, Who mercifully remembers His creatures, for life.

וְנִאֲמַן And You are faithful to restore the dead to life. Blessed are You, Adonai, Who resurrects the dead.
